## Important Information for Early College Students & Parents Acknowledgement

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<u>Calendar</u>. This includes the add/drop and withdrawal deadline.

We understand that as a Public high school student he/she is required to obtain appropriate textbooks and materials from the Instructional Materials Office and/or the high school. Approvals for instructional materials are

made by the high school. Students must be prepared on the first day of class with required materials. We understand that as a Private, Homeschool, or PEP student he/she must monitor the Tc - Sand S) & T.D Tc O Tw ()Tj EN college enrichment/non-degree program the student will be required to complete a new Early College application and contract.

## Accelerated Dual Enrollment (Public School Students Only)

We understand the entrance requirements are an unweighted high school GPA of 3.3. We further understand that as a high school student he/she must maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA at SCF to remain in the program. Failure to do so may result in expulsion from the program.

We understand that as a high school student he/she is encouraged to attend a first semester academic advising session with a success coach in the office of <u>College and Career Success</u>.

We understand that as a high school student he/she will participate in an accelerated program that meets both high school credit and coursework towards the AA degree requirements. A high school diploma must be met to also be eligible for the certification of an AA degree. If the student meets the requirements, the AA degree will be awarded in the subsequent semester (summer).

We understand the semester of graduation (last spring semester), the student must submit a graduation application and pay the graduation application fee. Students will be responsible for the cost of the ceremony to include cap/gown and any cords/sashes.

We understand that as a high school student he/she should contact the Program Director, SCF Early College for anything related to the Accelerated Dual Enrollment Program.
